

Shelby Humane Society Takes on 2014 Rachel Ray \$100K Challenge

Community Support Needed for Chance to Win \$100,000 Grand Prize and Save More Lives

Beginning June 1 through August 31 Shelby Humane Society will be a contestant in the 2014 ASPCA Rachael Ray \$100K Challenge. Shelby Humane Society is competing for a chance at more than \$600,000 in grant funding, including a grand prize of \$100,000. The 2014 ASPCA Rachael Ray \$100K Challenge is a nationwide competition for animal shelters (and their communities) aimed at getting more animals adopted or returned to their owners than ever before. Shelby Humane Society's goal is to save 1200 lives during the three month challenge.

"The ASPCA has referred to us as small but mighty," said Sara Shirley, Executive Director. "And we have embraced that. We are mighty when this small team and our amazing community unite to save more lives than ever before. This national competition is a great motivator and a great opportunity. Winning this challenge would provide much needed funding to support our community programs like our low-cost spay/neuter program, and our program to help keep more pets in their homes. All of us pulling together will have a lasting positive effect for our pets and our people."

All pets adopted from Shelby Humane Society have



been spayed or neutered, received age-appropriate vaccinations and deworming, and have been micro chipped.

We are hosting monthly adoption promotions, as well as increased off-site adoption events:

► At Petsmart on 280: Saturday, June 14, 28. Saturday, July, 12, 26. Saturday, August 9, 23. From 10 a.m.-5 p.m.

► At Petsmart in Alabaster: Every Sunday from 12 p.m.-4 p.m.

As well as unique events held at Shelby Humane Society Sunday, June 1, and Saturday and Sunday August 30-31.

We do all of this to create more Happy Tails like Bowie's. She was adopted during a mega-event we did in preparation for this challenge. This 40lb, 1-year-old, brindle lab/terrier mix had been with us for 5 months with little interest in her. By attracting a new audience, she was the first dog chosen that day out of nearly 60 adoption-ready dogs and is now happily a family member and running buddy.

- 2 Tablespoons of milk
- 1 and 1/2 cups of confectioner's sugar

Directions:

▶ Melt butter in a saucepan and stir in cocoa. Blend in the milk. Add the sugar 1/2 cup at a time. (Thin with a little milk if needed or a little more sugar if too thin.) Spread on cooled brownies.

Note: These turn out perfect with no hard edges if you bake them in an aluminum pan (12 1/4 x 8 1/8 x 1 1/8 Ready Mix cake pan) which sells for \$1 at Piggly Wiggly. It comes with a plastic lid so that you can cover them and tie with a pretty bow for a nice gift for someone special.

Over 400 grams of Synthetic Marijuana, also known as 'Spice', along with organic marijuana, and other narcotics were located and seized. Vick estimates the narcotics have an approximate street value of \$15,000. 16 persons were arrested, illegal firearms and ammunition were located and seized, along with numerous items of drug paraphernalia. Chief Vick reports narcotics investigators from his department have been conducting inves-

tigations into illegal drug use over the past several months. These warrants are a direct result of those investigations. More arrest are expected.

"We're committed to ensuring the safety of the citizens of the City of Columbiana." Vick said. "Illegal drugs lead to other crimes. We almost always find that the sale and use of illegal drugs are related to other crimes against persons and property. Now, we're being told that the sale of Synthetic Marijuana actually has direct ties to terrorism and Al Qaeda. We cannot tolerate this in our community. We cannot tolerate this in our state, or our country. It's up to each of us to say 'NO!' to drugs, and 'NO' to terrorism." Vick concluded.
