

**REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
CITY OF COLUMBIANA, ALABAMA
May 3, 2016**

The City Council of the City of Columbiana, Alabama met in a Regular Session in the Council Chambers of Columbiana City Hall at 6:00 p.m., Tuesday May 3, 2016. Mayor Handley called the meeting to order and asked City Clerk Mark Frey to call roll after the invocation and pledge.

The Mayor declared a quorum was present.

CONSENT AGENDA

- A. Approval of Minutes 04-19-2016 Regular Meeting.
- B. Request from Chief Lamar Vick for a 1 step merit increase for Mark Robinson moving from Pay Grade X Step 4 to Pay Grade X Step 5 effective on the next pay cycle.
- C. Authorizing the hiring of Alan Keef at Pay Grade VI Step 6 to fill full time position vacated by Skylar Martin's transfer to the Street Department.
- D. Authorizing the hiring of Hugh Shaw at Pay Grade V Step 1 as a temporary / seasonal worker for the Environmental Management Department.
- E. Authorizing the hiring of Ryan Clark at Pay Grade X Step 4 as a part time Police Officer for the PD.
- F. Authorizing the hiring of Allison Owens at Pay Grade V Step 1 as a part time Library Aid for the Library.
- G. Authorizing the hiring of Mitzi Matzke at Pay Grade V Step 1 as an on call Library Aid for the Library.
- H. Authorizing the hiring of Anna Taylor at Pay Grade V Step 1 as an on call Library Aid for the Library.

Council member Mayfield made a motion to accept the Consent Agenda which was seconded by Council member Whiting. The council voted and the consent agenda passed unanimously.

SWEARING IN OF POLICE OFFICER MORGAN

Mayor Handley invited new Police Officer Clayton Morgan to join him at the front of the Council Chambers and swore him in. The Council and Mayor welcomed Officer Morgan to the force.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

- **Administration** – City Clerk Mark Frey reported that he and Elizabeth Smith have worked countless hours on the Main Street Alabama application and he is hopeful that Columbiana will be one of the chosen cities this year. Revenue appears to be very strong and everything at City Hall is running smoothly.
- **Streets and Maintenance** – Allen Reynolds reported that his department is busy with garbage and grass cutting. They are waiting on the ground to dry out before they can get equipment in to do some storm water drainage system repairs. Allen reported that he is waiting on quotes for some street paving work as well.
- **Environmental Services** – Dale Lucas reported that the smoke testing that has been done in the last week has revealed approximately a dozen locations on private property that there are broken clean-outs. These breaks in the home owner's lateral lines are the responsibility of the homeowner to get repaired and they will be sent a letter to notify them of such. Council member Mayfield asked how much a repair like that may cost. Dale stated that it depends on if it is the cleanout or the lateral line. It can be as little as fifteen dollars to cap a cleanout break or more if a plumber has to come out and dig out the broken portion of the line.

Dale reported that the pump that they have been renting has been used during heavy rain events as well as when the power and generator failed at the plant. Mayor Handley asked Dale to look into purchasing one of these pumps instead of continuing to rent.

- **Police Department** – Chief Lamar Vick reported that his department is near full staff and Sgt. Bowers made a significant pot bust last week. Chief Vick noted that drug crimes are more prevalent during the summer months.

Mayor Handley asked about the additional part time officers that have been hired to keep at least 2 officers on shift 24 hours a day. Council member Whiting asked about the report of gunfire over on Nelson Walker road. Chief Vick reported that he was aware of the gun shots but has not been able to identify who was doing the shooting. Several City employees and Council members have heard a car backfiring around town. Citizens have reported the backfires as gun shots.

Council member Ruston asked about concealed carry at the ballpark. Chief Vick stated that there isn't anything that says that they can't concealed carry as long as they have a permit.

- **Fire Department** – Chief Howard reported that the air packs, masks, SCBA's and trucks have been inspected. Front tires for the Fire Truck were replaced and they were purchased from the State Bid List. They have received 22 calls and 11 were actual calls and the other half were 11 public assist calls. Chief reported that Rescue had 81 calls in the city this month. The new brush truck is having a problem with the transmission. It is under the warranty and will be taken to a transmission shop this week.

Council member Whiting and asked if someone called 911 because they fell – who would be dispatched? If the person isn't injured, the FD will respond. There was much discussion about how the FD and PD respond to a large amount of public assist calls.

- **Library** – Library Director, Tom Rary reported that the Event on the 18th at the Library. The Friends of the Library and the County are working to add an awning. There was a good turnout for *The Revenant* Movie. This month’s movie will be *RISEN* and pizza and drinks will continue to be served.

There will be 3 iPad minis that will be given away at the end of the Summer Reading Program and Tom noted that the circulation numbers are steady. Several new call-in personnel have been brought in to assist with covering hours of operation at the Library. These are on-call employees. Check the calendar for all of the many events.

Marketing

Marketing Coordinator, Elizabeth Smith stated that yesterday she took the Main Street Alabama application up to the committee. Her focus has been primarily on the Main Street project but after the 19th, her concentration will be on Liberty Day. There are lots of food vendors that have already turned in their applications and she is received dozens of calls per day about this event.

Council member Ruston introduced:

ORDINANCE 04-16-07

WHEREAS, J W Suttle and John Suttle have filed a petition with the City of Columbiana, Alabama, as required by §§ 11-42-20 and 11-42-21, Code of Alabama 1975, as amended, petitioning and requesting that the property hereinafter described be annexed to the municipality of the City of Columbiana, Alabama, which petition contained an accurate description of the property proposed to be annexed together with a map of the said property showing its relationship to the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana, Alabama, and the signatures of all of the owners of the property described were signed thereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIANA, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the City of Columbiana, Alabama, does adopt this Ordinance assenting to the annexation of the following described property to the municipality of the City of Columbiana:

See attached Exhibits A1, A2, A3, B and C.

2. That the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana, Alabama, be extended and rearranged so as to embrace and include such property, and such property shall become a part of the corporate area of such municipality upon the date of publication or posting of this Ordinance, as provided for in the Code of Alabama as cited above.

3. That the City Clerk be and he is hereby authorized and directed to file a copy of this Ordinance, including an accurate description of the property being annexed, together with a map of the said property showing its relationship to the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana, Alabama, to which said property is being annexed, in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama.

4. That the Zoning Map of the City of Columbiana, Alabama, and any other official maps or surveys of the City shall be amended to reflect the annexation of the above-described property, and that a copy of this Ordinance be transmitted to the City Planning Commission.

ORDINANCE NO. 05-16-01

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 04-16-02 AND AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 12-12-01 TO ADD AN ADDITIONAL PRIVILEGE TAX ON LIQUOR SALES

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Columbiana, Alabama, have deemed it necessary, proper, and for the benefit of the City to amend Ordinance No. 12-12-01 as previously amended (“Business License Ordinance”) to add an additional privilege tax on liquor sales;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIANA, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 04-16-02 is repealed..

Section 2. That § 32, Rate Schedule 8, of Ordinance No. 12-12-01 is amended to read as follows:

**“Rate Schedule #8
Beer, Wine and Liquor**

- 445 **Alcohol/Beer** – off premise - 050 \$50.00
- 722 **Alcohol/Beer** – on premise – 040 \$75.00
- 445 **Alcohol/Table Wine** – off premise - 060 \$75.00
- 722 **Alcohol/Table Wine** – on premise – 040 \$75.00
- 445 **Alcohol/Liquor/Package Stores** – off premise - 011 \$500.00
- 722 **Alcohol/Liquor** – Restaurant on premise - 020 \$500.00
- 722 **Alcohol/Liquor** – Lounge Retail Class I – 010 \$500.00
- 722 **Alcohol/Liquor** – Club Liquor Class II – 032 \$500.00
- 422 **Alcohol/Beer & Table Wine** – wholesale distributor -110 \$375.00
- 722 **Alcohol Special Event** – \$150.00 first day and \$100.00 each additional day

Requirements: Comply with all requirements pursuant to application for license with the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board Rate Schedule

In addition, upon every person, firm, or corporation engaged or continuing within the City in the business of selling at retail, other than the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board of the State of Alabama, any liquor or alcoholic beverages (excepting beer and table wine) an amount equal to two percent (2%) of the gross proceeds of such sales of the business.”

Section 3. This Ordinance Cumulative to General License Code or Ordinance. This ordinance shall not be construed to repeal any of the provisions of the general sales or use tax ordinance of the City, but shall be held to be cumulative, and the amounts of the taxes herein levied shall be in addition to the amounts of all other taxes imposed by the City.

Section 4. Severability. Each and every provision of this ordinance is hereby declared to be an independent provision and the holding of any provision hereof to be void and invalid for any reason shall not affect any other provision hereof, and it is hereby declared that the other provisions of this ordinance would have been enacted regardless of any provision which might have been held invalid.

Section 5. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective on the first day of _____, 201__, and the first payment of taxes hereunder shall be due and payable on the ____ day of _____, 201__. This ordinance shall remain in full force and effect and shall apply to each month of the year 201__, beginning with the month of _____ and to each month of each calendar year thereafter from year to year.

This is the first reading of Ordinance 05-16-01 and it will be considered for adoption during the next Council meeting on May 17th.

Council member Mayfield introduced the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE 05-16-02

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 353 AS PREVIOUSLY AMENDED TO FURTHER ADJUST THE BOUNDARIES OF THE ELECTION WARDS

WHEREAS, the City Council of Columbiana, Alabama, has annexed two parcels of real property to the city limits since the last time the election ward boundaries were amended in 2012;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIANA, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of §§ 11-40-8 and 11-46-23, Code of Ala. 1975, as amended, Section 2(c) of Ordinance No. 353, as previously amended by Ordinance Nos. 12-91-04, 02-92-02, 03-92-01, 12-03-01, and 03-12-01 is further amended by deleting subsection “WARD ONE” of said Section 2(c) as previously amended in its entirety and by substituting the following therefor:

“WARD ONE

The boundary of Ward One is: Beginning at a point which is the intersection of Egg and Butter Road (County Road 37) and the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana, thence proceed along said limits in generally a northwesterly direction to its intersection with Horton Farm Road. Thence move northeasterly along said road to its intersection with Jonesboro Circle (County Road 78). Thence head easterly along said circle to its intersection with Egg and Butter Road (County Road 37). Thence proceed northerly along said road to its intersection with Old State Route 25 West. Thence travel northeasterly along said route to its intersection with Walton Street. Thence head northwesterly along said street to its intersection with West College Street. Thence move westerly along said street to its intersection with State Route 25. Thence travel northeasterly along said route to its intersection with Joinertown Road (County Road 34). Thence proceed northwesterly along said road to its intersection with a Norfolk Southern Railroad. Thence move southwestly along said railroad to its intersection with State Route 70. Thence travel westerly along said route to its intersection with County Road 343. Thence head northerly along said road to its intersection with the south line of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 22, Township 21 South, Range 1 West. Thence east along the south line of said $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{4}$ section to a point 660 feet west of the SE corner of said $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{4}$ section. Thence run North 100 feet. Thence run West 446 feet. Thence run N 11 deg. 22 min. 30 sec. E for a distance of 266.42 feet. Thence run N 75 deg. 03 min. W for a distance of 332.05 feet to a point on the west line of said $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{4}$ section. Thence run north along the west line of said $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{4}$ section to a point 655 feet south of the NW corner of said $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{4}$ section. Thence run N 87 deg. 49 min. E for 669.61 feet. Thence run S 1 deg. 51 min. 30 sec. E for a distance of 520.49 feet more or less, to a point on the northerly line of County Road 343. Thence turn left and run along County Road 343 to a point which is 660 feet, more or less, west of the east line of said $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{4}$ section on the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana. Thence continue along said limits in generally a northeasterly direction to its intersection with the western right of way line of Chelsea Road (County Road 47). Thence head easterly to Chelsea Road (County Road 47). Thence travel southeasterly along said road to its intersection with State Route 25. Thence proceed southwestly along said route to its intersection with an unnamed road. Thence move southeasterly along said unnamed road to its intersection with Depot Street. Thence head southeasterly along said street to its intersection with Main Street. Thence travel southerly along said street to its intersection with County Road 47. Thence proceed southeasterly along said road to its intersection with Schultz Road. Thence move easterly along said road to its intersection with the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana. Thence follow said limits in generally a southerly direction to its intersection with County Road 47. Thence continue along said limits in generally a southeasterly direction and then a southwestly direction to its intersection with the eastern right of way line of an inactive railroad. Thence continue along said limits in generally a northeasterly direction to its intersection with Buie Road. Thence continue along said limits in generally an easterly direction to another intersection with Buie Road. Thence continue along said limits in generally a southwestly direction to its intersection with County Road 47. Thence continue along said limits in generally a westerly direction to its intersection with the western right of way line of an inactive railroad. Thence continue along said limits in generally a westerly direction and a northeasterly direction to its intersection with County Road 47. Thence continue along said limits in generally a westerly direction to the point of beginning, less and except those portions within the above described ward which are not within the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana.”

Section 2. Pursuant to the provisions of §§ 11-40-8 and 11-46-23, Code of Ala. 1975, as amended, Section 2(c) of Ordinance No. 353, as previously amended by Ordinance Nos. 12-91-04, 02-92-02, 03-92-01, 12-03-01, and 03-12-01 is further amended by deleting subsection “WARD

FIVE” of said Section 2(c) as previously amended in its entirety and by substituting the following therefor:

“WARD FIVE

The boundary of Ward Five is: Beginning at a point which is the intersection of the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana and Ferry Road (County Road 28), thence proceed northwesterly along said road to its intersection with Moore Street. Thence head northwesterly along said street to its intersection with Mardis Ferry Road (County Road 30). Thence move westerly along said road to its intersection with Old State Route 25 East. Thence travel southwesterly along said route to its intersection with Goodwin Street. Thence head northerly along said street to its intersection with East Sterrett Street. Thence move westerly along said street to its intersection with West Sterrett Street. Thence head northwesterly along said street to its intersection with State Route 25. Thence proceed northeasterly along said route to its intersection with Chelsea Road (County Road 47). Thence travel northwesterly along said road to its intersection with a point just east of the western right of way line of said road and the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana. Thence head westerly to the western right of way line of Chelsea Road (County Road 47) and the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana. Thence proceed along said limits in generally a northwesterly direction to its intersection with Beeswax Creek. Thence continue along said limits in generally a southwesterly direction and then a northeasterly direction to its intersection with the western right of way line of Chelsea Road (County Road 47). Thence continue along said limits in generally a northwesterly direction to its intersection with Rocky Ridge Road (County Road 343). Thence continue along said limits in generally a northerly direction to another intersection with Rocky Ridge Road (County Road 343). Thence continue along said limits in generally a northeasterly direction to its intersection with Chelsea Road (County Road 47). Thence continue along said limits in generally an easterly direction and then a northwesterly direction to its intersection with Weaver Creek. Thence continue along said limits in generally a northwesterly direction to its intersection with an unnamed road. Thence move northerly along said unnamed road to its intersection with the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana. Thence head easterly along said limits to its intersection with the northwest corner of Township 21 South Range 1 East. Thence continue easterly along said limits to its intersection with an unnamed creek. Thence continue along said limits in generally a southeasterly direction to its intersection with an unnamed creek. Thence continue along said limits in generally a southwesterly direction to its intersection with an unnamed creek. Thence continue along said limits in generally a southwesterly direction and then an easterly direction to its intersection with the western right of way line of Bethel Road (County Road 49). Thence continue along said limits in generally a southerly direction to its intersection with the northern right of way line of State Route 25. Thence continue along said limits in generally a westerly direction to its intersection with an unnamed creek. Thence continue along said limits in generally a northwesterly direction to its intersection with the boundary line of Township 21 South Range 1 West. Thence continue along said limits in generally a southwesterly direction to its intersection with an unnamed creek. Thence continue along said limits in generally a southeasterly direction to its intersection with a Beeswax Creek. Thence continue along said limits in generally an easterly direction to its intersection with the eastern right of way line of State Route 25. Thence continue along said limits in a northeasterly direction to its intersection with the southern edge of Washboard Road. Thence continue along said limits in generally a southerly direction to its intersection with Washboard Road. Thence continue along said limits in generally a southeasterly direction to its intersection with the eastern right of way line of Alston Farm Road. Thence continue southerly along said limits to its intersection with the southern right of way line of Mardis Ferry Road (County Road 30). Thence continue along said limits in generally a northeasterly direction to its intersection with Beeswax Creek. Thence continue along said limits in

generally a southwesterly direction to its intersection with the southern right of way line of Mardis Ferry Road (County Road 30). Thence continue along said limits in generally a southerly direction, **including the S½ of the NW¼ of the SW¼ and the SW¼ of the SE¼ of Section 20, Township 21 South, Range 1 East**, to its intersection with the northern right of way line of Ferry Road (County Road 28). Thence continue northwesterly along said limits to its intersection with Lynn Drive. Thence continue along said limits in generally a southwesterly direction to the point of beginning, less and except those portions within the above described ward which are not within the corporate limits of the City of Columbiana.”

Section 3. The Clerk is directed to file within five days after its adoption a certified copy of this Ordinance, accompanied by a map or plat showing the election ward boundaries, with the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama, and to publish notice thereof, without a copy of such map or plat, as provided in § 11-46-23, Code of Ala. 1975, as amended.

Section 4. All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby specifically repealed.

Section 5. The provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and if any part of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and publication or posting as required by law.

This is the first reading of the Ordinance and it will be voted on during the next Council meeting.

Council member Ruston introduced the following:

RESOLUTION 05-16-03

AUTHORIZING MAYOR TO SIGN A CONTRACT WITH RDS FOR ALCOHOL TAX COLLECTION

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City of Columbiana as follows:

1. That the City enter into a contract with PRA Government Services, LLC d/b/a RDS for collection of alcohol tax, which contract is before this council;
2. That the contract be executed in the name of the City, for and on behalf of the City, by its Mayor.
3. That the contract be attested by the Clerk and the seal of the City affixed thereto.
4. That RDS will receive an amount equal to two 1.85% of gross revenues collected, for providing remittance processing services and revenue analysis services.
5. That the agreement is for a period of 7 months from the effective date unless terminated by either party.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon the completion of the execution of the contract by all parties, that a copy of such agreement be kept on file by the City Clerk.

THEREUPON, Council member Ruston moved and Council member Whiting seconded the motion that said resolution be given vote, and said resolution passed unanimously by a roll call vote of all members of the Council. The results of the vote were:

RESOLUTION 05-16-04

A RESOLUTION AWARDING THE BID FOR THE REHAB ON THE HWY 25 WASTE WATER PUMP STATION TO BAMA UTILITY CONTRACTORS, INC.

WHEREAS, the City of Columbiana operates a waste water treatment facility with a waste water pump station located on the Hwy 25 Bypass; and

WHEREAS, said pump station has become more costly to maintain due to the overall age and wear and tear on the equipment; and

WHEREAS, this system is necessary to handle an ever increasing volume of waste water.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Columbiana, Alabama, at the recommendation of engineer for the city, Dave B. Bechtel, P.E. of Utility Engineering Consultants, LLC. as follows:

1. That the City of Columbiana accept the low qualified bid submitted by Bama Utility Contractors, Inc. at the total bid price of \$69,300.00.
2. That the Mayor and City Clerk are authorized and directed to execute all documents necessary to be signed by the City in order to carry out the terms of this resolution.

Council Member Ruston made motion to award the bid to Bama Utility Contractors, Inc. which was seconded by Council Member King, and passed by a roll call vote by all members present in order to proceed with the rehab of the Hwy 25 Bypass pump station project.

MAYORS REPORT


- Mayor Handley reported that Kelly Fox with Hand Arendall has spoken with Terry Bentley about their progress on their project. The Mayor asked Terry to provide project scope and list of what is left to complete the project by the next meeting.
- The pavilion at the Old Mill Square has been demolished and this area will be the staging area for the new City Garage and Shelby County Arts Council. This is the start of phase 1 and it is moving forward.
- The Library is being enlarged by 2800 square feet. This is a county building and they are going to be working on this project in the coming months.
- Shelby County is temporarily relocating all of the offices within the County Commission building into the newly acquired building next door and the Ray building while that building is being remodeled.
- Main Street Alabama – This has been quite an extensive process. This is not a City run project, but Elizabeth, Mark and countless others have invested several hundred man-hours on this project. There are weekly meetings leading up to the presentation on May 19th. Everyone involved sees this program is the vehicle that can make a huge difference for Columbiana.
- Crime Grant – Last week Mayor Handley discussed a federal crime grant that is available. Reggie Holloway is working on this with the City and feels that we have a good chance to get it. In order to qualify for this grant, you must have a “hot spot” of crime. This is not just a law enforcement grant. This includes education and civic assistance, mentoring of the children, education, pocket parks and other opportunities to make a difference.
Part of this program also assists the Columbiana Police Department with building relationships with the residents and especially with the children in this high risk area. The Mayor has contacted Judge Kramer about providing statistical information for this project. Council member Whiting added that this grant can assist with walking trails and street lights. Reggie is working hard on this program in preparing for this grant. Mayor Handley noted that the new lights that were installed on Nelson Walker have made a great impact on crime in that area.


- The Shelby County girls’ softball team will be competing in a regional game and the Cornerstone Chargers girls’ softball team is going to State as well.
